Brock Bettle (L) and Thomas Mazzeo (R) joined us as summer interns working to support all areas of the clinic.









Similar to the summer heat, GNMC has been in full force, inside and outside the clinic. GNMC's good work has been recognized by many organizations these past two months. As Executive Director, I had the privilege to be out in the community representing GNMC on many occasions ranging from education, grant recipient, and volunteer wall unveiling, to being awarded the Ethics in Business Award by the Sea Island Rotary.

Once again, we are growing our collaborations and taking full advantage of these relationships to better serve our patients. We utilized the **Lowcountry Outreach** facility while over 20 staff and volunteers completed training in SBIRT (Screening, Brief Intervention, and Referral to Treatment) as we continue our journey in the fight to help those affected by opioid abuse. We also assisted the family of a patient in legal matters with a referral to one of our new partners, Lowcountry Legal Volunteers. The patient needed disability, but could not afford the legal support. The process became overwhelming and created a huge financial burden as his care needs increased. Family members wept while meeting to explain the services our new partner can provide. Patient experiences like this allow us to recognize more than ever the value of treating the whole patient.
